General Benefit Categories

SERVICE CONNECTED (SC) COMPENSATION:

- based on service related disability
 - ➢ <u>or</u> death

NON SERVICE CONNECTED (NSC) PENSION:

- based on non service related disability <u>or</u> death,
- ➤ wartime service,
- \blacktriangleright income and net worth



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Eligibility

<u>Status</u>

- > Who is an applicant?
- ➤ Who is a claimant?
- How do we determine the difference between?

Requirements

- Substantially complete application requires:
- Claimant's name
- Service Data
- Statement of disabilities claimed
- Proper Signature
- Income Information (Pension, Parents' DIC only)
- Social Security Number



Types of Claims

Formal

- On prescribed form
- o Substantially complete

Intent to File

- o On prescribed form
- Must be followed with a formal application <u>if not in file</u>

Original Claim

• The first claim filed by a Veteran or claimant (establishes their compensation record)

Reopened

- A claim after <u>final</u> disallowance of an earlier claim on the same issue.
- A decision becomes final one year after the claimant is notified of the decision.
- Requires <u>new and material</u> evidence to reopen the claim.
 - <u>New Evidence</u>: existing evidence not previously submitted to VA decision makers.
 - <u>Material evidence</u>: evidence must relate to the reason the claim was previously denied



Types Of Claims (cont.)

Requests for Reconsideration

- A request for a benefit that was previously denied
- The denial is less than a year old
- Therefore, the decision is not final
- The claim is still open for reconsideration

New Claim

- A review of new evidence based on new application
- Is factually distinct from the former claim
- Does not involve any reconsideration of an earlier disposition

Claim for Increase

• Any application for an increase in rate of benefit being paid

Inferred Issues

- Involves issues derived from the consideration or outcome of related issues
- o Often involves ancillary benefits
- See M21-1MR III.iv.6.B.3 for examples

Fully Developed Claims (FDC)

• Evidence submitted *with* the claim to minimize processing time

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NSC Pension and Survivors Benefits

NSC Pension

- Special monthly Pension (SMP) based on
 - Need for aid and attendance or
 - o Housebound status
- Additional Veterans Pension benefits for a Veteran with a child incapable of self-support

Survivors Benefits

- Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)
- o DIC under 38 U.S.C. 1318
- o DIC under 38 U.S.C. 1151
- o Survivors Pension and Parents DIC
- Additional survivors benefits based on:
 - o Need for aid and attendance or
 - o Housebound Status



- An <u>entitlement</u> decision is a decision made by a Veterans Service Representative (VSR)
- A <u>rating decision</u> is a decision made by a Rating Veterans Service Representative (RVSR)
